# Plant of the Month Selaginella kraussiana 'Gold Tips'

Selaginella: < L selago –like a mall selago (former name of club moss); ella- diminutive

This species (kraussiana) is native to Africa and grows well in the southern United States. It is both cold and heat hardy for our area. It grows so well here it can become weedy in the garden. This is a small to medium terrestrial plant in the clubmoss family.

Lateral leaves are ovate and finely dentate-serrated and acute. These plants do well in moist soil and humid areas. Selaginella has about 750 species.
