# May 8, 2010 Field Trip:

We're off to see the W......

Woodwardia, (Dryopteris) intermedia, Selaginella, Adiantum, (Nephrolopis exaltata) 'Roosevelt, Dennstaedtia = W.I.S.A.R.D. (No 'Z' ferns at Casa Flora so 'S' had to do) in the land of Oz.

The "Wizard" behind Casa Flora would be Naud Burnett II. In 1947 when 19 year old Naud graduated from Texas A&M with a degree in landscape architecture, there were only about nine ferns regularly available for his landscape business. He had to ask previous clients if he could divide and transplant their fern to the next client's garden. Today, we can choose from more than 100 varieties of hardy ferns, largely due to the Dallas based horticulture company Naud founded along with his son Burke, Casa Flora. Casa Flora is the largest fern producer in the U.S. and has introduced more than 70 varieties of tropical and hardy ferns to the international market.

Casa Flora pioneered tissue culture, which can produce exact replicas of the parent fern, in the 80's making it possible to mass produce varieties that were previously found only in their native lands or in a few enthusiasts' collections. Tissue culture also allows for consistent year round production of ferns, which in case I have not mentioned before, we are extremely fortunate to receive our ferns from Casa Flora for our monthly projects.

This is a rare opportunity, so, pack up your walking shoes, bring your camera, paper, pencil and head off to Dallas, the land of Oz, and see the W.I.S.A.R.D.

The tour to the trial gardens will go to an old green house facility that was started in 1928 with glass houses that they do not use, and the fiberglass green house that they do use. The fern garden has wonderful sandy loam soil, is shaded by large oak trees, and is in front of the house of the previous owner. The trial garden shows what plants will survive the Dallas 100 degree heat of summer to the freezing winter, with temperatures as low as 19 degrees.

The group at the production facilities will further be divided into smaller groups. One group will tour and have an explanation of the tissue culture and spore room, while the other group tours the greenhouse facility.

BUTTTTT, we are not quite done yet in the land of Oz. Naud Burnett II designed the Dallas Arboretum's showpiece, the Jonsson Color Garden AND the Palmer Fern Dell, with 90 types of ferns planted along a meandering stream and humidified with an automatic misting system developed by NASA. Hoo Yaa!

Many of us pilgrims are driving to Dallas the night before (about a 5 hour drive from Houston, not counting getting lost, asking for directions and going to the bathroom) and staying at the La Quinta Inn & Suites, 1000 Dowdy Ferry Rd, Hutchins, Texas 75141, phone # 214-269-1015, see maps.

The field trip will REPLACE our usual meeting scheduled for May16th.

May Book Review By: Frank Lee

"Hawai'i's Ferns and Fern Allies" by Daniel D. Palmer

This book is the first comprehensive survey of Hawai'i's ferns to be published in more than one hundred years. It covers endemic, indigenous, and naturalized ferns and fern allies (including rare and endangered plants). It contains more than 100 drawings along with detailed descriptions for all 222 species, varieties, and forms, and some hybrids. The author also includes information from Hawaiian folklore and mythology, describes uses of ferns by native Hawaiians, and updates Hawaiian common names.












### Maps for May Field Trip to Dallas


