Houston Federation of Garden Clubs meetings start up again this month after a summer hiatus. They meet on the second Friday of the month at the Houston Garden Center at 10:30 AM. September's meeting is on the 10th. The speaker will be Dr. Jim Johnson from Texas A&M. His program's title is "Designs That Say More".

Some other interesting goings-on include a fall trip to the countryside to Visit Painted Churches sponsored by the Federation - Wednesday, October 13. This is an all day event leaving from the Garden Center at 7:45 AM. It will take place Saturday, Sept. 11, 8:45 AM to 3:30 PM at the Houston Community College West Loop Campus. ### September Book Review

"The Fern Dictionary" by Wilbur W. Olson

This book has been designed to be of value to everyone interested in ferns. The two concerns of this book are names of ferns and definitions of words as they apply to the study of ferns. The book is divided into three sections. One section is devoted to a listing of common names of ferns and their associated botanical names. The second section lists the genera that are being used and that have been used. The third section is a glossary giving the botanical definition of words, particularly as they are applied to ferns. And of course, as in any dictionary, pronunciations are included.
