October 17 – Mercer Arboretum & Botanic Garden Tour

Anita Tiller, our guide for our fern garden tour at Mercer Arboretum, received a B.S. in biology/chemistry with emphasis on plant communities' ecology in 1979 and an Environmental Science certificate in 1980 from the Univ. of AL. She received an M.S. in Botany at Univ. of FL, Gainesville with an emphasis on aquatic botany in 1983. Her field biology training includes terrestrial and aquatic vegetation mapping, avian and mammalian ecology and limnological monitoring in FL and AL for university and federal government grants. Through the 13 years as she worked as a scientist and manager for clinical and research labs at the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at UF and Baylor College of Medicine, Houston, she also studied at the School of Forestry, Wildlife Biology at UF and the Dept. of Ecology & Evolutionary Biology at Rice Univ. in Houston. Anita accepted a position as botanist and conservation manager at Mercer Arboretum and Botanic Gardens, Harris County Precinct 4 in December of 2000. As Center for Plant Conservation officer at Mercer Arboretum and Botanic Gardens, Humble, TX, she coordinates plant conservation efforts throughout east Texas and the Upper Gulf Coast with numerous governmental agencies. She teaches for the Texas Master Gardener, Mercer's Texas Gulf Coast Gardener, Texas Master Naturalists programs and has authored numerous scientific and conservation publications and presentations. Anita, a life-long naturalist and certified Texas Master Naturalist, promotes ecologically sound gardening practices and her backyard "refuge" reflects her love for wildlife, herbs, and vegetables with a tropical ambiance.

November 21 – Fern Reproduction

Our program for November will be presented by Joan Nester-Hudson, Department of Biological Studies, Sam Houston State University. Joan is a well established member of the fern community. She will bring us a lively program on sex, in ferns that is, complete with dissection microscopes and live material. This will not be g-rated! Don't miss the show!

October Book Review

“Gardening with Nature in Texas” by Karen M. Breneman

This book provides the basic principles to garden successfully, provide habitat for wildlife, reduce pollution of air and water, and improve quality of life. You will learn about native plants and their importance to conservation of natural resources and wildlife, working with nature to reduce watering requirements and pesticide usage while maintaining a landscape, gardening in the shade, alternatives to turf grass, producing healthy vegetables, and creating a water feature and surrounding habitat to promote wildlife. Following the suggestions outlined in this book will not only promote colorful flowers and healthy plants, but also reward the gardener with beautiful butterflies, hummingbirds, and other desirable wildlife.

A regular monthly meeting was held at the Houston Garden Center, Houston, Texas.

The meeting commenced at 2:15 PM with President, Donna McGraw calling the meeting to order.
