Professional membership (\$40) includes the benefits above plus access to the American Fern Journal.



Fern of the Month - April 2024 Coniogramme emeiensis, 'Golden Zebra'

This is one great looking variegated fern! The color and even pattern of the variation makes nearly everyone fall in love with it.

The origins of the plant is in the mountains of China, the magical Mt. Emei, for those familiar with the area. This fern will grow to be about 2' tall with a slow-spreading growing habit extending around 4' wide when planted in the ground. The fronds will form arching fronds that are beautifully colored that dance in the breeze. If we get back to our normal summer temperatures, of just the high 90's and occasional 100F it is ground hardy. Yes, it will take our winters but not the summer we had last year. It is a zone 7-10. So, you might want to leave it potted this first year so you could bring it into the house and keep it as a house plant for tremendously hot days like last year.

This is a perfect house plant! Thick leaves for the low humidity in our homes, moderate water and moderate light. Potted, you will still get your height, but the pot will contain the spread so you can keep it in what size pot you need for your space. This is a very easy and forgiving plant to grow in doors.

Defiantly worth giving a try.
